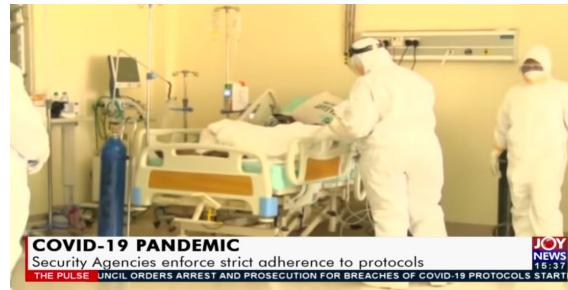


Dear Clients,
